Chair's report Chair, Dr David Moseley

I am pleased to be presenting this 2022 Annual Report on behalf of the Board of Directors.

At the beginning of 2022, we welcomed Mr Stephen McGinley to the role of Executive Principal. The transition was seamless and the College has continued to grow in quality and culture under Steve's leadership. He has built strong relationships and is collaborating strongly across the many domains of the College, to listen, lead, and develop clear strategic initiatives to build the College into the future.

The 40th Anniversary celebrations were a moving and meaningful highlight of 2022. A series of commemoration and celebration events were well-attended by founders, governors, staff, students, families, and alumni. The breadth and depth of community connections and recollections were remarkable.

Significant College developments and strategic initiatives were progressed and completed during 2022. The Education Model - developed by the executive team - describes 'People, Program, Place, and Practice' domains that provide an effective scaffold for strategic planning. The completion of the Tony Sheumack Centre for Performing Arts and the Jenny Williams Centre for Human Movement was a significant milestone. The centres are used regularly by all students across the College and are greatly appreciated by the College community. The Pakenham through-road project was completed and saw considerable improvement to the function, safety, and services at the campus. Design and development planning on major redevelopments of Middle School facilities at Pakenham Campus was undertaken. The *Digital Environment Strategy* was finalised and approved. This strategy will completely redevelop the digital framework of the College and position the College strongly to lead and implement future-focused and personalised education.

Risk, regulatory, and compliance governance continued to grow in complexity and is well managed by the executive and Board. The new Engagement Strategic Plan was developed. New College website and communication platforms were designed and implemented. The Beacon of Hope Foundation strategy commenced, enshrining the College's ongoing commitment to service programs, and developing the framework for philanthropic and service development for the future. The College Reconciliation Action Plan was finalised and implemented with an impressive suite of reconciliation educational actions and outcomes. The partnership with Anglican and Uniting leadership developed over 2022, aimed at maintaining and building opportunities to collaborate on shared priorities.

Staff recruitment, wellbeing, equity, and development were key priorities for the executive and Board. Staffing across Early Learning and P-12 was a consistent challenge during 2022 and strong leadership and strategy was evident to minimise impact on student education. The demographic analyses commissioned by the College provided valuable insights into the development of our region that have directly informed medium and long term strategic planning. The College enrolments and financial position continues to grow in strength and consistency.

Finally, I want to acknowledge and thank the Board directors, company members, Board advisors, College executive, and teams across the College, for the outstanding skills and commitment they bring in the service of the students and families.

Executive Principal's report

Executive Principal, Mr Stephen McGinley

Beaconhills College began 2022 with 3168 students enrolled from Little Beacons to Year 12 across both campuses at Berwick and Pakenham. Through the College's continued focus on sound financial management, as well as high student enrolments, Beaconhills has continued to maintain its strong financial position. Most importantly, 2022 allowed the College to return to nearly all programs which were disrupted so heavily during the COVID-19 pandemic. It was wonderful to see students return to the extensive learning experiences that make up the Beaconhills education. With overseas programs still suspended, 2022 saw the return of our Beacon Explorers programs, South-Eastern Independent Schools Association (SEISA) sporting competitions and productions with more opportunities for our families to be back on school grounds. All these activities played a vital role in supporting the return to positive routines, and allowed our students to participate in the formative experiences we know are so important in their lives.

Throughout the year, teachers focused on the return of face-to-face classes which included adjustments to teaching practice and curriculum. These were key measures required to successfully transition students back to school. Beaconhills continued to deliver an impressive array of VCE results with 191 students, from a cohort of 226, receiving an ATAR score. Twenty-seven students achieved an ATAR above 90, 64 students above 80 and 104 above 70. Beaconhills prides itself on providing a range of pathways through the VCE that include direct placements in further education, or the workplace after completing a school-assessed VCE. Beaconhills students sought many different pathways beyond school with 184 students proceeding with a Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) application.

The College continued to progress the *College Strategy* focusing on providing value for our families. An outstanding contemporary education that is affordable for our community continues to remain the key focus for the College leadership team. There is now more time to plan these future innovations, rather than responding to the direct impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. The community centres at the Berwick Campus were completed, with the new Year 7 and 8 building at Pakenham also underway. The human movement and performing arts centres at Berwick will provide new facilities for not only our students, but also the broader community. Ongoing upgrades to our indoor and outdoor classrooms continued. Further planning went into the implementation of the *Digital Transformation Project*.

Beaconhills College celebrated 40 years in 2022. Since its establishment in 1982, Beaconhills College has grown from a small school of 34 students to a multi-campus school of over 3000 students. Our anniversary year had many occasions where we could pause and reflect, with gratitude, on the contributions of all who have helped shape our community school.

To all members of the Beaconhills College community; the Board, company members, students, families, alumni, and staff, thank you for being part of a school that aspires to be *a shining light in education*.

Principal's report

Berwick Campus Principal, Mr Sam Watson

2022 was a year of celebrations as we reflected on the 40 years of Beaconhills College and the return to consistent face-to-face learning opportunities. While there had been much learning around the efficiencies of online learning and practices, we were rapidly reminded of the value and importance of being together as a community, in person. There was a focus on supporting the transition of students back to school and an appreciation that not everyone had the same experiences during the periods of lockdown. We understood the importance of instilling confidence in our students and families about returning to school and COVID safety. It was incredible to see the engagement of our students in the many co-curricular opportunities the College was able to provide. This engagement increased exponentially across the year as confidence grew in the College's ability to safely run its programs.

Following many years of planning and construction, the campus was finally able to open - in late term 3 - the Tony Sheumack Centre for Performing Arts and Jenny Williams Centre for Human Movement. Named in honour of two of the Berwick Campus' greatest servants, these incredible facilities will provide countless opportunities for generations of Beaconhills students and members of our wider community. The first major event to be held in the theatre was the campus musical *GREASE*, led by a cast of incredibly talented students and supported by the passionate performing arts department. The production enabled the College to showcase the functionality and versatility of this leading theatre. As a campus, this was the first time in years that we had been able to come together as one and a significant step towards the post-COVID era of Beaconhills College.

Our students continued to shine in all aspects of their life, demonstrating academic, athletic, performance, artistic and citizenship excellence. We were incredibly proud of the combined efforts of the Class of 2022, with 17 students achieving an ATAR greater than 90. Following on from her Top Class honours in 2021, Ruby Thornton-Mackay was awarded the Berwick Campus Dux with an ATAR of 97.75. All Year 12 students who applied to the Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre received an offer to attend university, with most students choosing to study in either health, engineering, commerce and or society and culture-related courses. This was an incredible achievement for a group of students who had spent much of their time in Senior School learning virtually and highlighted the resilience and personal responsibility they had developed.

The Berwick Campus is excited to celebrate its 20th Anniversary in 2023 and find further opportunities for us to come together as a community.

Principal's report

It is my pleasure to present the *Annual Report* for the Pakenham Campus of Beaconhills College for 2022. In our 40th Anniversary year, Beaconhills College continues to be a vibrant and dynamic learning community, dedicated to providing our students with the knowledge, skills, and values they need to succeed in the 21st century.

With the easing of restrictions, it was possible for students to participate again in the holistic programs offered at Beaconhills College. These productions showcased the exceptional talent of our students and staff and demonstrated our ongoing commitment to fostering creativity and artistic expression within our College community.

It was also another successful year for our Year 12 students, with students demonstrating strengths across all areas and achieving the results needed for their future pathways. In 2022, 108 students completed Year 12 with students selecting both scored and unscored pathways. Campus and College Dux Jasper McDowell achieved an ATAR of 99.85 which was an outstanding achievement. We are incredibly proud of our Year 12 students and the exceptional results they have achieved. They are a testament to the hard work and dedication of not only our students, but also our staff and the College's commitment to providing a well-rounded and engaging learning environment. I have no doubt that students from the Class of 2022 will continue to make positive contributions to their chosen fields and communities, and we wish them all the very best in their future endeavours.

In 2023 we will continue to build on the successes of the past year and further develop our programs and services to meet the evolving needs of our students and community.

Pastoral care of teachers will always be an important ministry for the chaplains, and we are thankful to have had the opportunity to minister to our peers throughout the year.

2022 VCE results


The benefits of a holistic Beaconhills education shone through in the strong VCE results for the College's Class of 2022.

College Dux was Pakenham Campus student Jasper McDowell with an ATAR of 99.85, while Ruby Thornton-Mackay was Berwick Campus Dux with an impressive 97.45.

Of the 191 Beaconhills students who obtained an ATAR, 27 students ranked above 90, 64 above 80 and 104 above 70.

There were 52 study scores of 40 and above across a range of subjects. Many of the top students were actively involved in College life, from pursuing their interests in sport and school productions to studying languages.

Other students who completed portfolio subjects like Media or Visual Communication Design have already secured tertiary pathways for excellence in their VCE studies.

Management of non-attendance

Daily procedures

Tutors electronically mark the roll on the College database. Parents are requested to email the College absence BerwickAbsences@beaconhills.vic.edu or PakenhamAbsences@beaconhills.vic.edu by 9.30am to report absences. The College electronically records the names of any students whose parents have called to confirm they will not attend school for any part of the day, along with the names of students on excursions, camps or sporting activities.

For unexplained absences, parents of all students are sent an SMS asking them to confirm the absence no later than 10.30am. The College database is amended to reflect that an SMS has been sent to the parent/guardian.

Rolls are completed electronically every period for Years 5-12, and twice daily at tutor and period 5 for Junior School. If a student is absent more than three days in a row and there is no explanation received by a parent, contact with the family is made by the Head of House, the Deputy Head (for Year 9) or the Head of Junior School.

Ongoing procedures

A report outlining all 'unexplained' absences is sent to each Head of House, Deputy Head of Section and Head of Section on Thursday afternoon (Pakenham Campus) and Friday afternoon (Berwick Campus) for follow-up. Heads of House, Deputy Heads of Section, and Heads of Section are required to monitor extended absence patterns.

All leave for holidays during the school term for more than three consecutive days must be approved by the Campus Principal.

Parents must contact the College before an early collection time with the details. Students must have a note from their parent/guardian or have a parent/guardian present to sign out of the College during school hours.



Business management

Director of Strategy and Business, Mr David Young

During 2022, several major developments were completed in accordance with the College's master plan for each campus. Capital expenditure amounted to \$11.9 million and the following is a summary of major developments completed.



Berwick Campus

The College completed the Berwick Campus Community Arts and Recreation Centre, now known as the Tony Sheumack Centre for Performing Arts and the Jenny Williams Centre for Human Movement. This multi-level complex provides facilities for music, dance, drama, and a range of performances. It also includes areas for sport, recreation, health, and fitness and an acoustically-designed performing arts auditorium with stage and seating for 630 people.

Pakenham Campus

Construction was completed on the through road at the Pakenham Campus.

This project has delivered improved access for cars and pedestrians in designated areas independent of bus movements. Buses now flow from the west side of the campus (Toomuc Valley Road) to the east, exiting onto Pakenham Road. The project also involved the upgrade of the storm water drainage systems and other infrastructure to support the future Middle School developments planned for construction.

Planning and design continued on several upcoming developments, with the main focus being on the replacement of the Middle School facilities at the Pakenham Campus.

The first stage of construction, being the new Years 7 and 8 Centre, began in the second half of the year and was severely impacted by inclement weather which delayed the completion of the project. This project includes the construction of 12 new classrooms, amenities, a staffroom, breakout spaces, and a large multi-purpose area. The project is due for completion in August 2023.

The second stage of the Middle School redevelopment will be the construction of a Year 5 and 6 Centre, which will involve the reconfiguration and extension of existing facilities.

Both stages of construction will lead to the demolition of the existing Middle School buildings. These were some of the original buildings established when the College first opened.

Learning spaces upgrades


In 2022, the College continued its program of upgrading learning spaces across each campus. This involved the replacement of student classroom furniture through a staged replacement program.

In addition, work began on enhancing the acoustic performance and layout of rooms to support the students' learning experiences. This work was based on research undertaken by staff into developing a policy that specifies the essential elements needed in each space to support learning.

External landscape areas were also reviewed as alternative learning areas to indoor settings, where several outdoor areas across the College were upgraded as part of this program. This facilitates complementary areas to indoor environments and is part of a long-term landscape master plan being developed by the College.

Sources of income and expenditure for 2022.





Staffing
