

Beaconhills College's contemporary uniform - from Early Years to Year 12 meets the learning needs of all students.

OUR UNIFORM

Retaining the historical links to Beaconhills colours, our quality, all-season uniform is both smart and comfortable. It is designed to promote physical activity, positive body image and offers flexibility in student choice.

It is important that students wear the uniform correctly - and with pride.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The College has two main variations of our school uniform to best meet the needs of our program.

- The formal uniform the academic 'wardrobe' is a range of connected all-season garments.
 Students can choose to wear items on any day of the year suited to the weather and to reflect their personal preference and identity. There is no separate 'summer' or 'winter' uniform (although navy tights can only be worn with the Beaconhills tunic or tartan skirt).
- The sport uniform is worn for Physical Education, sporting competitions, practical Sport and Physical Education classes and activities that relate to our experiential learning programs.

Wearing the uniform correctly gives students a sense of pride and connection to the College. All uniform items should be worn clean and in good condition.

- Items from the formal uniform and the sport uniform should not be combined.
- Non-uniform items should not be worn.
- The formal uniform is the standard school uniform that should be worn each day, unless the sport uniform is specified for a particular excursion or activity.
- There is an ageappropriate approach regarding change between the sport uniform and the formal uniform (see FAQs).

JUNIOR SCHOOL (PREP-YEAR 4)

Students from Prep to Year 4 wear either the formal academic all-season uniform or sport uniform depending on their learning programs for the day. Girls now have the options to wear Beaconhills skorts, shorts or tailored pants to enable more freedom of movement in the playground.

WHEN CAN STUDENTS WEAR THE SOFT SHELL JACKET?

Students may wear the soft shell jacket as part of the sport uniform.

Students may also wear the soft shell jacket to accompany the formal uniform in cold/ wet weather to or from school and outside. The shell jacket should not be worn to replace the blazer as the outermost garment for Years 5-12 students travelling to and from school. It should be worn over the blazer.

If students are in formal uniform, the soft shell jacket cannot be worn inside.

SHOES

Formal black leather school shoes (including T-bars for girls) of a plain variety should be worn all year with the formal uniform.

CAPS AND HATS

Students in Junior School must wear either the bucket hat or legionnaire cap with both the formal and sport uniform from mid-August until the end of April.

WHEN CAN STUDENTS WEAR TIGHTS?

The tights may only be worn with the tunic.

WHEN DO STUDENTS NEED TO TUCK IN THEIR SHIRTS?

Students must tuck in the longsleeve shirts when wearing the formal uniform. The short-sleeve shirts have been designed with a band at the bottom and do not need to be tucked in.

CAN STUDENTS WEAR BRANDED SOCKS WITH THE SPORT UNIFORM?

Students may wear either the uniform shop-purchased socks or plain white socks (no logos or emblems) purchased elsewhere.

PREP TO YEAR 6 - NO CHANGE POLICY

If students have any timetabled Sport or Physical Education classes for that day they are able to wear the sport uniform all day.

STUDENTS DO NOT NEED TO WEAR THEIR FORMAL UNIFORM ON THESE OCCASIONS:

Prep-4 (Junior School):

- if student has Sport or Physical Education class on that day
- if student has been instructed to wear their sport uniform for an experiential activity
- at inter-House carnivals (swimming, athletics, cross-country)
- on casual clothes days.

HAIR, NAILS AND MAKEUP?

Obvious makeup or coloured nail polish is not permitted. French tips are allowed. For Prep to Year 8, hair that is shoulder-length or longer should be neatly tied back off the face and collar with a navy, gold or tonal hair fastener. Ribbons in House colours from the uniform shops may be worn.
